Dr. Brent M. Powers currently serves as Chief Medical Officer at Lexington Medical Center (LMC). LMC is a community, non-profit, single hospital system of 428 licensed beds located in West-Columbia, SC. LMC has a medical staff of near 600 providers, employees over 400 providers in over 50+ physician groups, operates one of the busiest Emergency Departments in the state, six Urgent Cares and two ambulatory surgery centers, and owns the largest skilled nursing facility in the state.

Dr. Powers is responsible for medical staff governance and alignment, Emergency Department operations to include the employed ED physician medical group, and quality improvement efforts in the acute care space. He remains clinical active in both in the inpatient and ambulatory space, working as a general internist. He has served in his current role since July of 2011.

Dr. Powers is a husband of 21 years, father of 3 daughters, and active member at Mt. Horeb United Methodist Church. He is a previous trustee on Lexington District One School Board, serving 2012-2016. He enjoys the outdoors through hiking, hunting, and fishing. He enjoys playing piano with his daughters and is an avid reader.

Serves as the Executive Director of Palmetto Care Connections, a non-profit telehealth network for SC. PCC works with existing telemedicine/telehealth providers to promote/expand their services as well as with new up and coming applications. PCC primarily focuses on improving access to care for rural populations. Kathy has 20 years of experience in rural health care working with various types of providers to improve the overall health care delivery systems as well as to recruit and retain providers in those communities. She spent more than twelve years working to foster relationships, develop partnerships and promote shared services between health care providers in Allendale, Bamberg, Barnwell and Hampton counties by developing and coordinating the first not-for-profit rural health network in the state. Kathy has also served in various capacities of leadership and management in the rural hospital setting.

Kathy received her undergraduate degree in Business Administration from the University of South Carolina and holds a Masters in Health Administration from the Medical University of South Carolina.
